# **BOARD BRIEFS**

March 2, 2004

A regular business meeting of the Board of Education was held on Monday, March 1, 2004, in the Middle School Cafeteria in the Middle School/High School, located on Route 38 in the Town of Dryden. Members present: J. Curatolo, R. Dickinson, T. Edgecomb, C. Gibbons, B. June, K. LaMotte, D. Mott, A. Young. Also present: Dr. Archambault, District Administrators, 19 District employees, 12 community members 11 students, and 3 members of the press.

#### **REPORTS AND COMMENTS -**

- Dr. Archambault, Superintendent of Schools, introduced Roger Fedele, Middle School Principal.
   Mr. Fedele reported that the first day in Dryden MS had gone well.
- 2. The MS Student Senate will host a welcome reception for Mr. Fedele on March 8<sup>th</sup> at 7PM in the MS Cafeteria.
- 3. Mr. Premo, Dryden 3-5 Principal, introduced Jacqueline Matthews, Fulbright Exchange Teacher in Grade 3. Mrs. Matthews is exchanging classrooms with Kathy VanRiper for 6 weeks.
- 4. Marty Christofferson, District resident, shared projected costs for a Modified, JV, and Varsity Lacrosse program.
- 5. Several other community members spoke in support of the Lacrosse program.
- 6. The Board discussed the 2004-05 spending plan.
- 7. Mary Kay Hickey, Science Department Chair, stressed to the Board that they would not be able to teach their science program if any position is cut.
- 8. Dan Perkins, Student Liaison to the Board, reviewed the results of the AP survey, commented on the semi-formal last weekend, and reminded the Board of the High School Musical "Oklahoma" on March 11-13 at 7 PM each night.
- 9. Dr. Archambault reported on the early dismissal on March 30, 2004, for Dr. Jim Garbarino to meet with K-12 staff. Cass/Freeville students will dismiss at 12:45 PM, DES students at 1:00 PM, and MS/HS students at 2:10 PM. Dr. Garbarino will spend the day meeting/talking with students.
- 10. Dr. Garbarino will speak to/with parents at 7 PM on Tuesday, April 13<sup>th</sup> in C-13 in the MS. He will discuss bullying and what adults can do to address this issue.
- 11. Rachel Dickinson, Board President, gave an update on the Superintendent search. Board members discussed the cafeteria as a location for future Board meetings. It was agreed that the Board would hold their future meetings in the Middle School cafeteria.
- 12. Donna Mott reported on the No Child Left Behind meeting.
- 13. Joan Stock, Staff member, encouraged the Board to move to change titles of special education aides to teacher assistants.
