- (1) Highway Supt, Clerk and Supervisor receive single coverage with the Town paying 100% of the premium. If they need family coverage, the Town pays 75% of the premium. This is the same for all employees. Part-time elected officials or employees may join the health plan, but must pay the premium.
- (2) Full time elected officials are covered 100%. Part-time (Supervisor, Town Justice and Councilmen) are not covered.
- (3) Current justices get full family also, but new employees and elected officials will not receive the same benefit.
- (4) Board members, Supervisor and Justices are not covered for health insurance.
- (5) Part-time elected officials and employees pay 50% of premium.
- (6) Town pays 75% of premium for full time, nothing for part time.
- (7) Full time elected officials & employees are covered 100%.

*Elected officials are covered providing certain criteria are met, that criteria being different for each town. The percentage of premium also varies, in some cases depending on years of service.
