## Summary of Major Plan Proposals

- 1. Three residential densities established with low density development predominating in the town, medium density areas located in the Ithaca-Cortland corridor and along major highways, and the most dense residential development in the two villages, especially in Dryden where water and sewer facilities are available.
- Multi-family construction permitted in all residential zones when zoning density regulations are complied with and design quality is maintained.
- 3. Flexibility in the development of non-residential land areas accomplished by means of controls established through zoning.
- 4. Designation of southern hill area as undeveloped open space and conservation land with development restricted to farming or to recreation and conservation oriented activities.
- Remove Route 13 from the village of Dryden and relocate it as an arterial highway north of Freeville with grade separated intersections with local roads at Etna-Pinckney Roads, Route 38 and Fall Creek Road east of Freeville.
- 6. Improve intersection of Routes 366 and existing 13 at the Etna turnoff.
- Realign Brooklyn Road in Freeville to eliminate problem of bridge repair and replacement.
- 8. Expand existing parking behind Main Street stores in Dryden and develop a landscaping and decorating plan for Main Street.

- 9. Establish major industrial districts in western portion of the town between New York State Electric and Gas headquarters and the proposed arterial.
- 10. Establish, through easements or purchase, a ribbon of conservation land along Fall Creek and Virgil Creek to prevent continued random and uncontrolled development and to protect these areas as public property.
- 11. Establish a 1600 acre conservation, preservation and wetland area along Beaver Creek in conjunction with the relocation of the Route 13 arterial. Possibility of a low dam and shallow lake in this area should be explored with the State Conservation Department, State Division of Water Resources and Cornell University.
- 12. Acquire and develop a town park of about 100 acres along the southern boundary of the village of Freeville containing picnic facilities and space for active recreation activities.
- 13. Acquire and develop small neighborhood playgrounds for daily family recreation needs in Varna, Etna, Ellis Hollow, and both villages.
- 14. Locate the Tompkins-Cortland Community College in the Ithaca-Cortland corridor, preferably along Route 38 between the high school and George Junior Republic.
- 15. Consider replacement of existing schools in Freeville and McLean with new facility located on the high school site.
- 16. Strongly support efforts to deal with problems of refuse disposal at a county or multi-town level.
